

Definitions of Small and / or Diverse Businesses

- Minority Business Enterprises (MBE) consist of African American Owned, Asian-Indian Owned, Asian-Pacific Owned, Hispanic Owned and Native American Owned Businesses. The National Minority Supplier Development Council (NMSDC) defines a MBE as a for-profit business that is at least 51% owned, managed, and controlled by a member(s) of a qualified minority group. To be considered a member of a qualified minority group, a person must be a United States citizen who is Asian-Indian, Asian-Pacific, Black, Hispanic, or Native American. Ownership by qualified minority individuals means the business is at least 51% owned by such individuals or, in the case of a publicly owned business, at least 51% of the stock is owned by one or more such individuals.
- Women Business Enterprises (WBE) is defined by Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC) as a business that is at least 51 percent owned, controlled, operated, and managed by a woman or women. This means one or more women must have unrestricted control of the business, a demonstrated management of day-to-day operations, and a proportionate investment of capital or expertise.
- LGBT-Owned Business Enterprise (LGBTBE) is defined by <u>The National LGBT Chamber of Commerce (NGLCC)</u> as a business that is at least fifty-one percent (51%) owned, operated, managed, and controlled by an LGBTQ person or persons who are either U.S. citizens or lawful permanent residents.
- **Disability-Owned Business Enterprises (DOBE)** is defined by <u>Disability:IN</u> as a for-profit business that is at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a person with a disability regardless of whether or not that business owner employs person(s) with a disability.
- Service-Disabled Veteran Disability-Owned Business Enterprises (SDV-DOBE) is defined by <u>Disability:IN</u> as a business which is 51 percent owned, controlled, operated, and managed by a veteran, who sustained their disability during their time of service.
- Veteran-Owned Business Enterprise (VBE) is defined by the <u>U.S. Small Business Administration</u> as a business with 51% of the business owned and controlled by one or more veterans whose military service can be confirmed by VA.
- Small Businesses is defined according to the size standard corresponding to any NAICS
 code listed in the business's profile in the federal System for Award Management (SAM)
 available from the <u>U.S. Small Business Administration</u>.
- HUBZone Certified businesses are expected to comply with following demands: Be a small business according to <u>U.S. Small Business Administration size standards</u>. Be at least 51% owned and controlled by U.S. citizens, a Community Development Corporation, an agricultural cooperative, an Alaska Native corporation, a Native Hawaiian organization, or an Native American tribe. Have its principal office located in a HUBZone. Have at least 35% of its employees living in a HUBZone.
- Small Disadvantaged Businesses are expected comply with following demands: The firm
 must be 51% or more owned and controlled by one or more disadvantaged persons. The
 disadvantaged person or persons must be socially disadvantaged and economically
 disadvantaged. The firm must be small, according to <u>U.S. Small Business Administration</u>
 size standards.
